Position: Community Crew Time Commitment: At least 4 hours per month

- Support the varying projects under the Common Ambition Bristol umbrella through either event support or outreach (as outlined in the roles above)
- Deliver sexual health messages to your peers, communities and/or networks
- Be in regular contact with the Project Coordinator
- Adhere to CAB's policies and procedures

Skills and Experience needed:

- To be part of the African or Caribbean network/community or have peers/links you can access
- An interest in sexual health
- To feel comfortable to talk about sexual health
- A non-judgemental approach and an empathetic manner
- Good time management & organizational skills
- Respect for diversity & commitment to equal opportunities

Training & Support Provided:

- Full training & induction
- Regular 1-2-1 support from the Peer Coordinator
- Reimbursement for out-of-pocket expenses (up to a reasonable amount)
